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A message from Dr. Lisa

It all began with a simple offer of help during her pets' annual visit to The Pet Cross. I gratefully accepted Kimberly Bolding's assistance. She brought experience from the non-profit sector to support my veterinary skills. After five years of being a one woman band, it was apparent that The Pet Cross was expanding faster than one person could handle.

The first major shift in 2025 came with our focus on data collection. We started surveying clients, documenting hours worked, and counting the number of pets seen. Analyzing this data provided valuable insights. We learned that over half of our clients identify as disabled, and 75% report an annual income of less than \$30,000. Throughout the year, the number of pets seen at each clinic steadily increased, illustrating the immense need for affordable veterinary care and the limited options available.

As our data grew, so did our board. We recruited individuals from varied backgrounds, each bringing unique skills but united by a shared passion for pets and their owners. I was amazed at the speed with which volunteers stepped forward to support our small non-profit. Today, our board includes professionals with expertise in insurance, mental health, spiritual guidance, grant writing, banking, and administration. Their fresh perspectives and ideas have invigorated our efforts to better serve our clients.

We next focused on expanding our volunteer base, drawing from our existing clients. This approach offered them new opportunities and purpose. The act of giving back fosters strong bonds and brings about positive change. Our volunteers have formed connections through their shared love of pets and their commitment to helping others.

Over the past year, The Pet Cross has grown in ways I never imagined possible. As we look ahead to 2026, we are relocating our primary facility, opening additional clinics, welcoming more doctors, and forming partnerships with other organizations to broaden our services. Our Facebook page has helped raise awareness, attracting new donors and volunteers. I am deeply grateful for the support network that has developed, allowing us to better serve our community of pet parents. I eagerly anticipate the opportunities and growth the new year will bring.



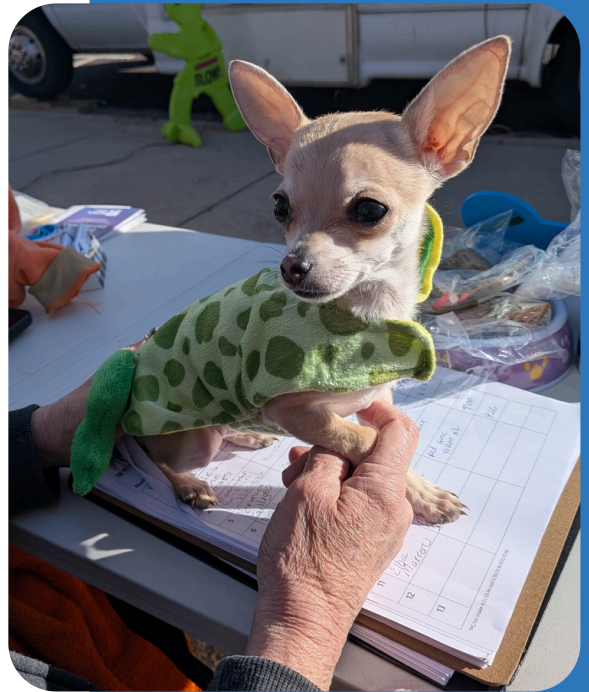
Our Mission

Our clinic includes a pharmacy and a laboratory that allows us to **provide basic veterinary care**, such as preventative medicine, treating infections, and illnesses.

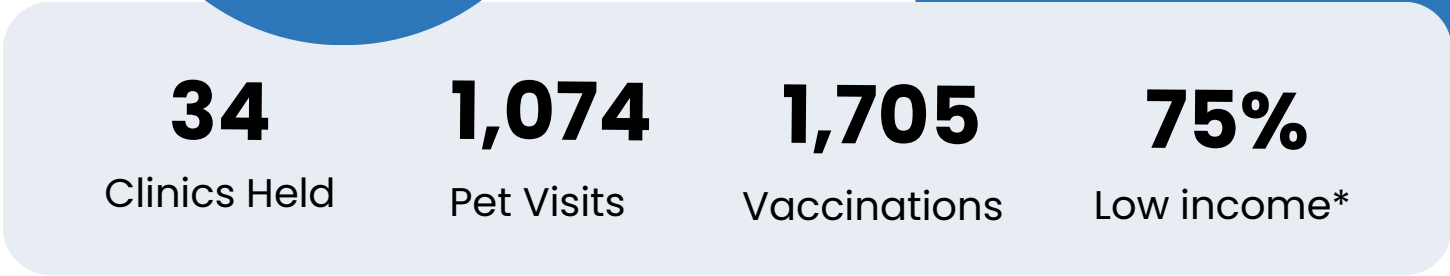

“Without this clinic, I don’t know what I would have done. You treated both me and my pet with kindness.”

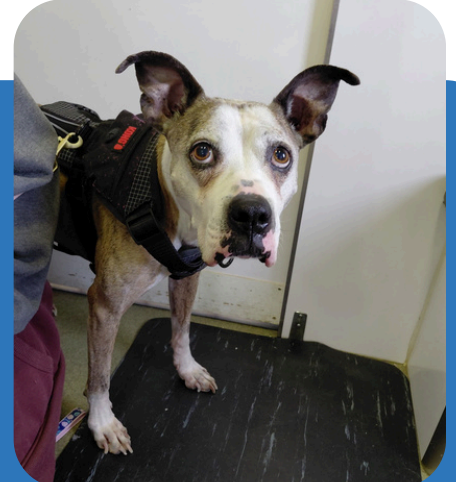
When Marco came to The Pet Cross, he was navigating limited income, ongoing health challenges, and the daily stress of caring for his companion dog, Rufus. For Marco, Rufus was not “just a pet,” but a source of comfort, routine, and emotional support during a difficult season of life.

As Marcus, a military veteran, experienced bouts of depression, Rufus became a stabilizing presence — helping him cope, connect, and find balance in his day-to-day life.

Through The Pet Cross, Marco was able to access essential veterinary care and pet supplies, including food, that he otherwise could not afford. Keeping Rufus current on vaccinations was especially critical, as it allowed Marco to maintain his housing and avoid further instability.

Marco expressed gratitude for the respect and kindness shown by the volunteers. He felt welcomed and valued.
